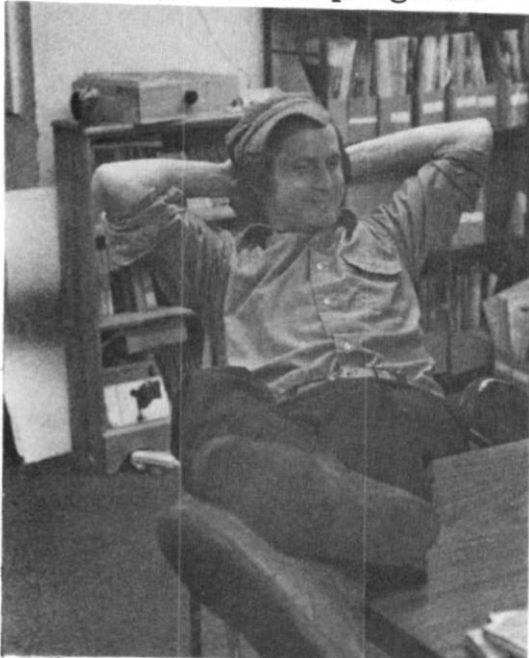
CAROL LIEBER

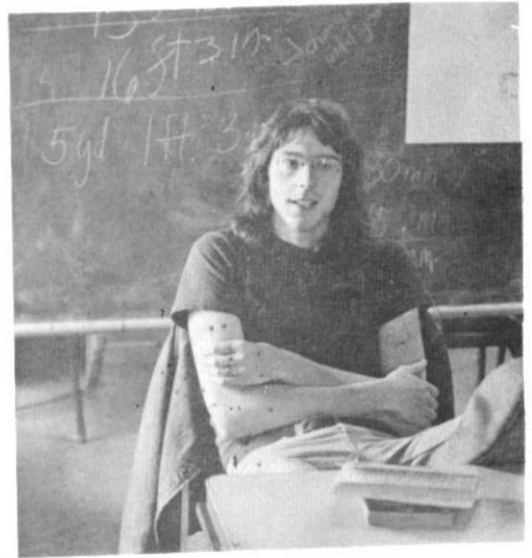
ANDY ROTHSCILD

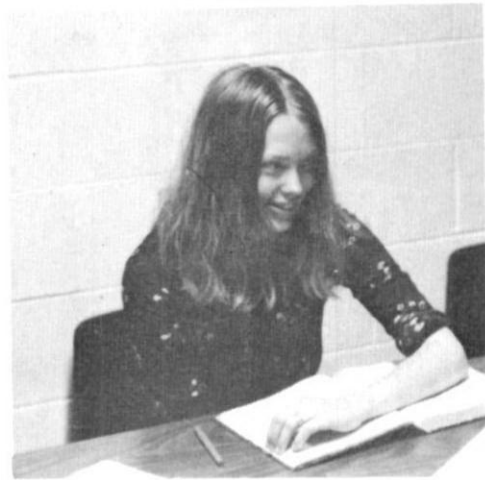


JOHN CHASNOFF

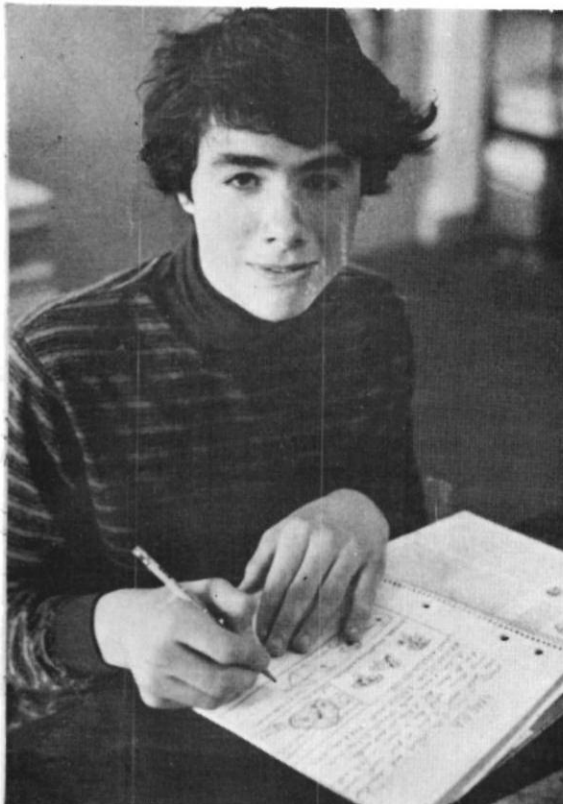
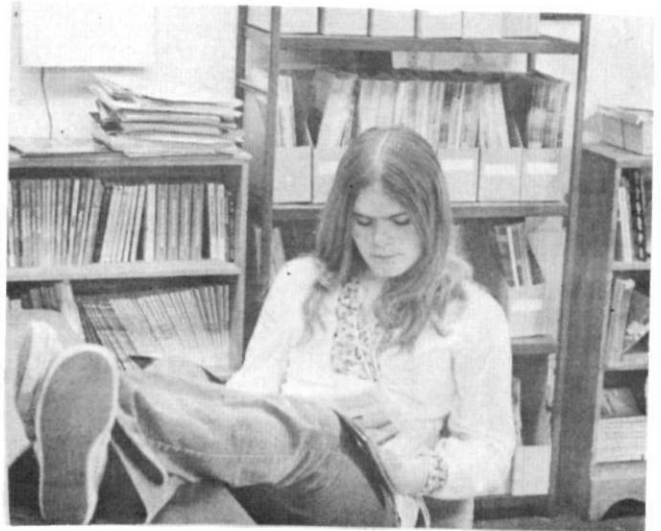
BRIAN MCNEAL

DAVID STARR

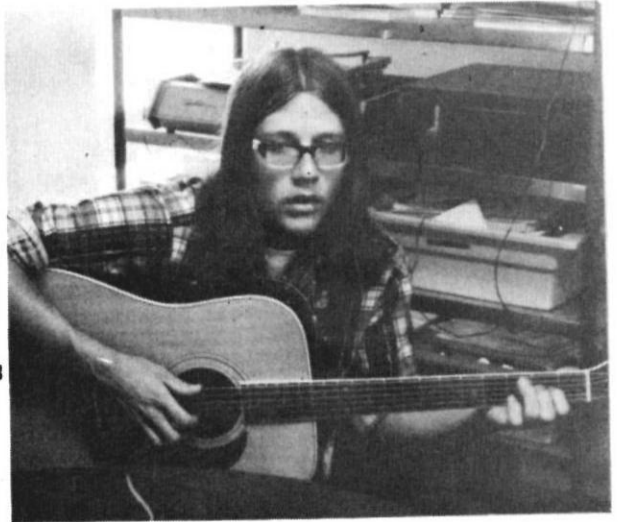

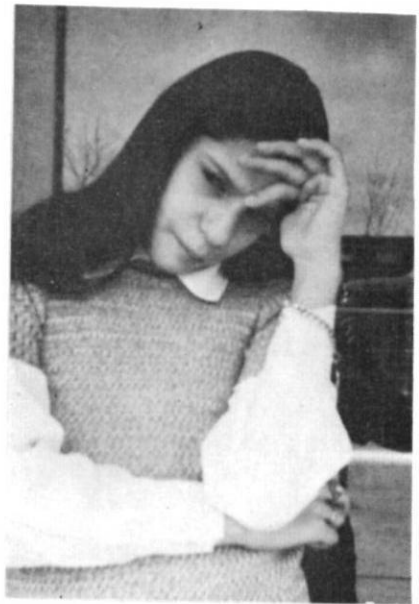
KIMBERLY REYNOLDS

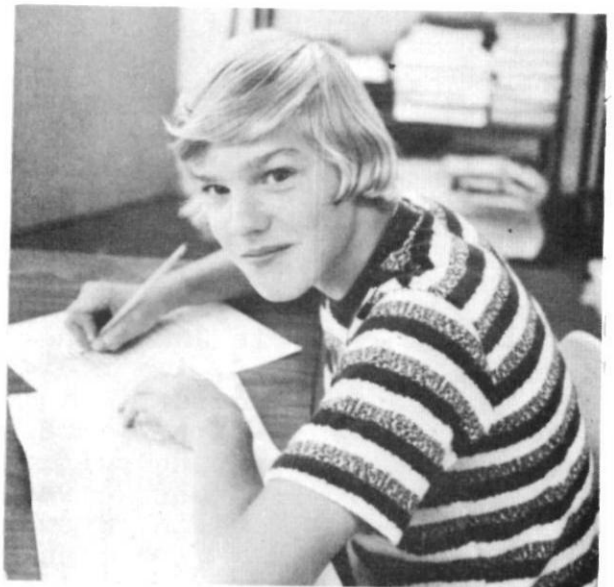


HEATHER ANN BROOKS

BILLY HAUB

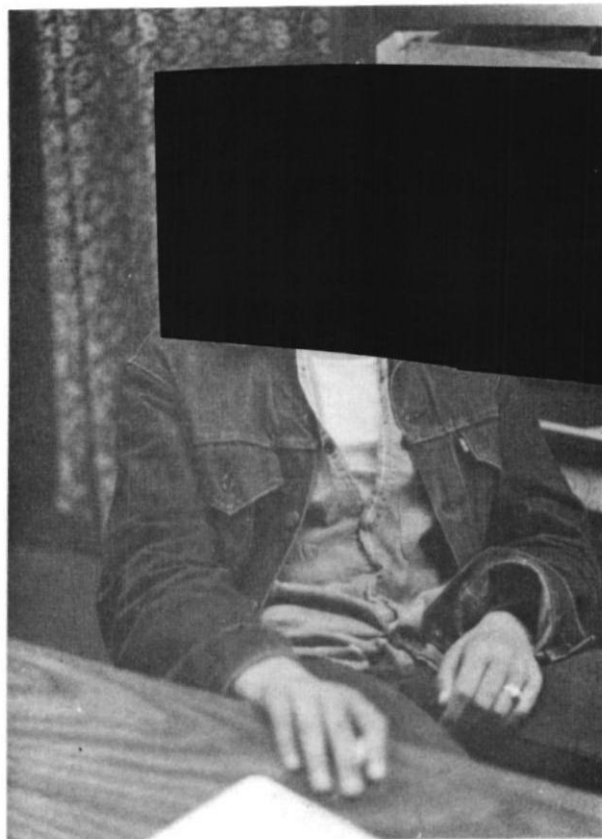

BILLY SINGFIELD



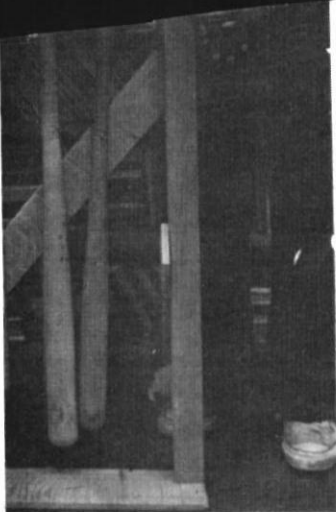

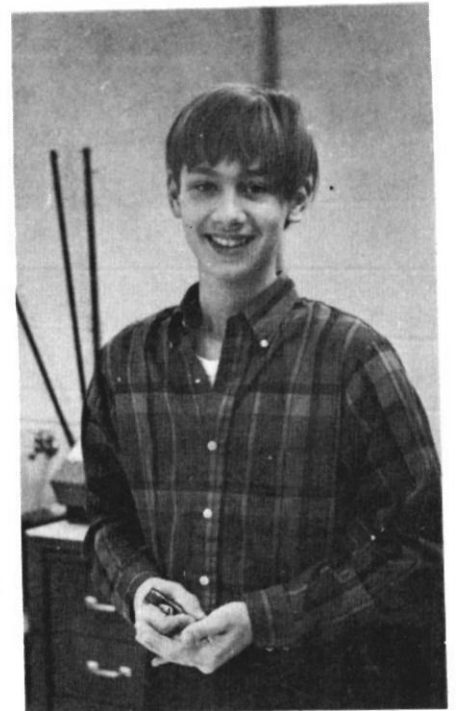
← VICTOR DOTSON

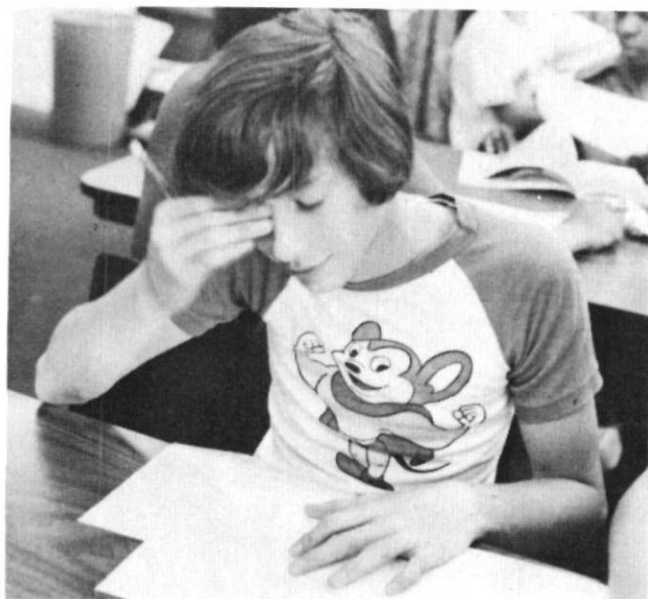


← ADELL BLACKMON

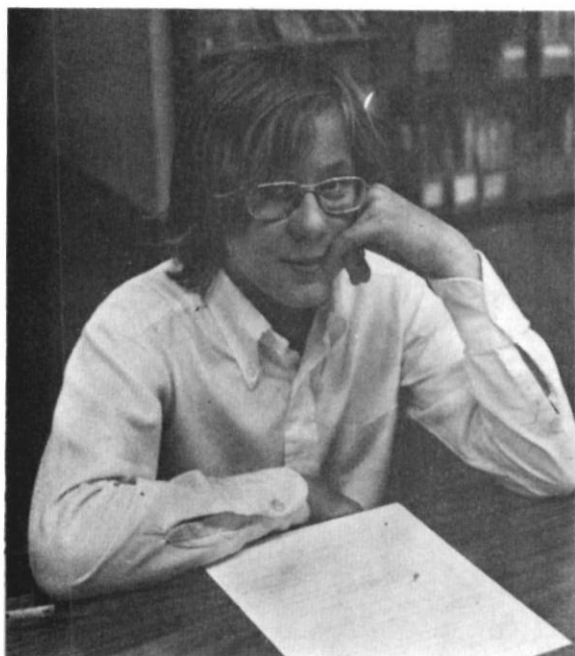


LOGAN MARTIN

DONNA NOBLE

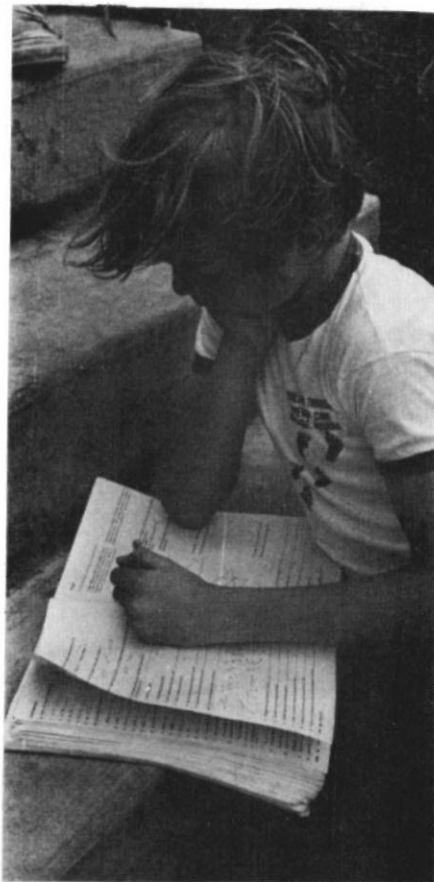

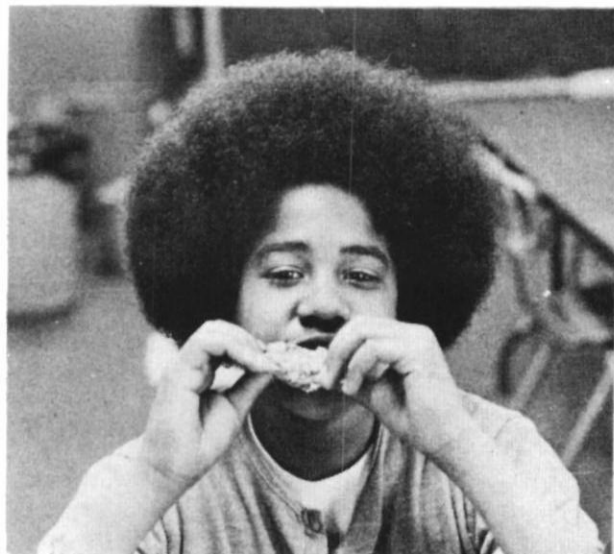


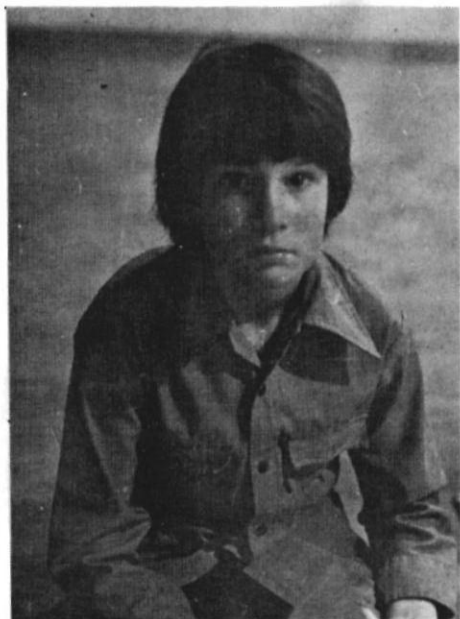
JON MESSENGER

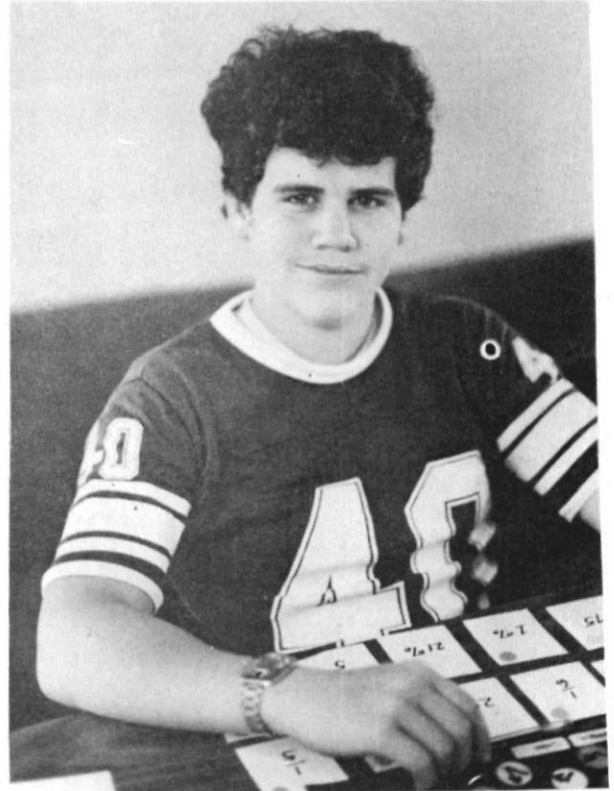

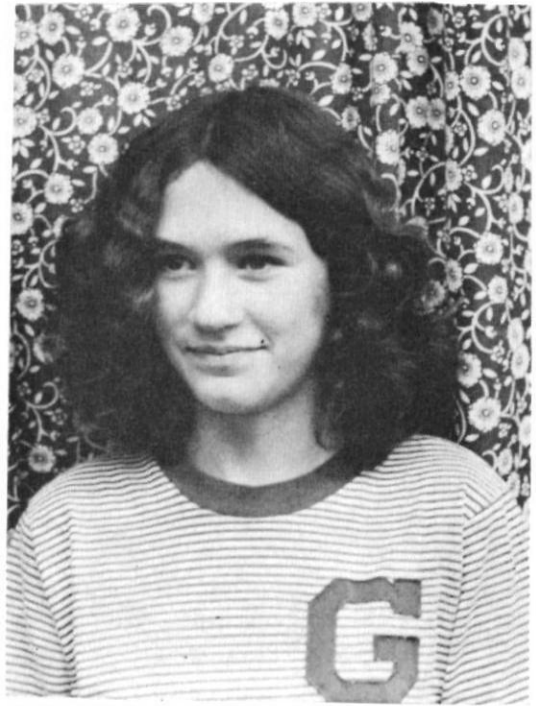
JIM JORDAN

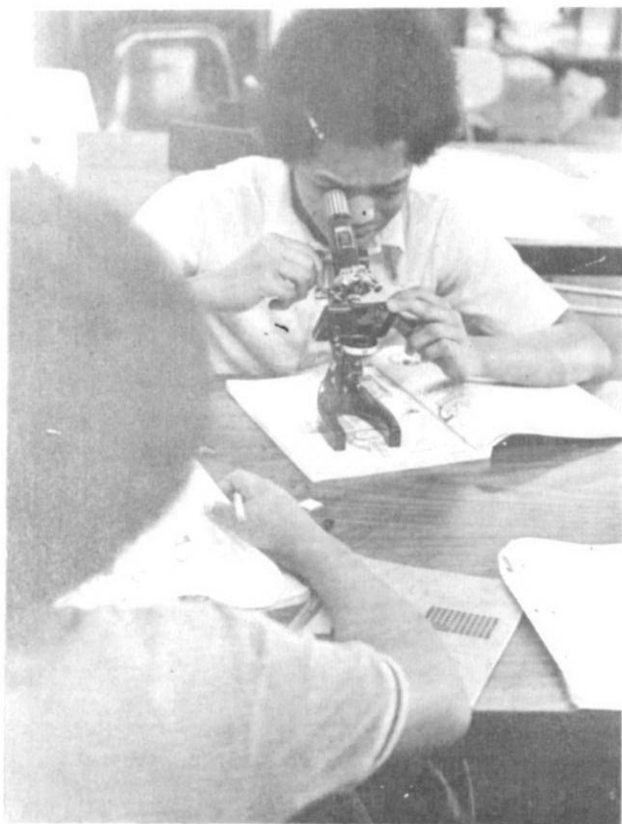

In Campcraft, John and George showed us how to come out alive if we ever get stranded in the woods! We learned to build fires without burning down a forest, and we learned how to cut wood without cutting off a foot!



In Art classes, students worked on contour drawings, charcoal sketching, and water color painting. We also did paper mache and crayon batik as well as taking sketching trips to many places in St. Louis.

In Sewing class, our most important task was learning how to fix broken machines! We finally got our patterns cut and made pants and tops.





In Weaving class, we learned about weaving techniques as well as learning how long it takes to warp a loom. Carol designed many of the looms we used to make tapestries and belts.

Silkscreening was taught for two mini-mesters. In the first course many kinds of paper stencils were used. Later we made crayon and glue stencils. Our final project was silk-screening T-shirts



To put together the Yearbook, we took lots of pictures and wrote biographies of all 50 kids. Carol and Rachel spent a lot of time making sure everyone got their assignments in. We were up to our ears in rubber cement and layout sheets.



In Pollution and Recycling, we discussed with many resource people the causes and effects of pollution as well solutions for a cleaner environment. We set up a recycling center in LaCleda Town.



In Photo-Architecture, we made a huge inflatable room, visited architect firms and buildings, and took and developed photos of our urban environment.



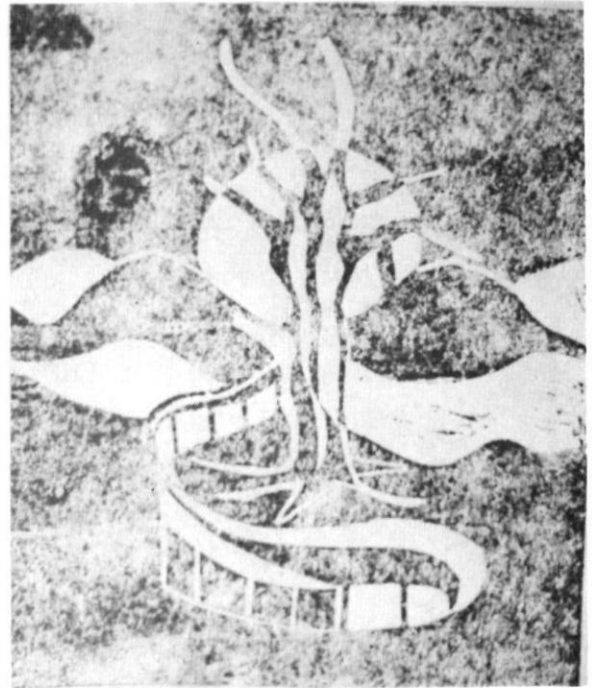
