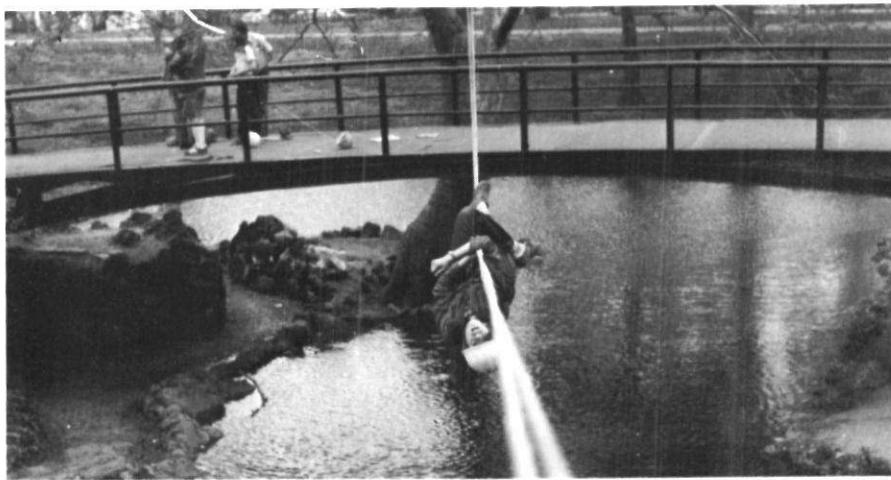

There is a wide variety of unique classes at Crossroads. I liked Debate the most and learned how to collect and organize information.





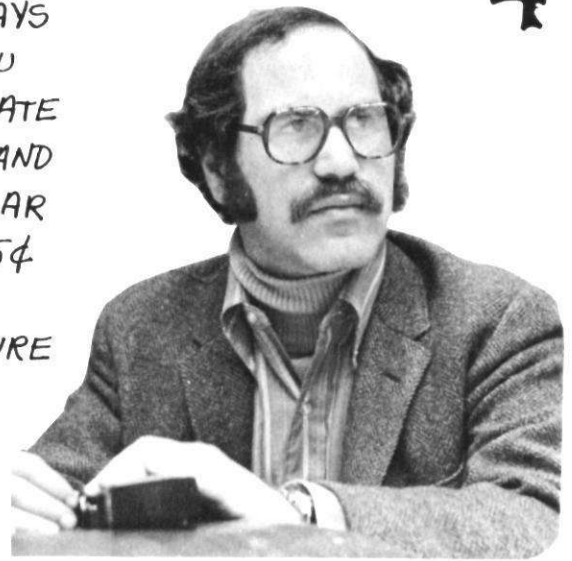
The expectations at this school are higher than at other schools. If you really want a good grade, you have to earn it!

Catherine & Susan debate political issues.



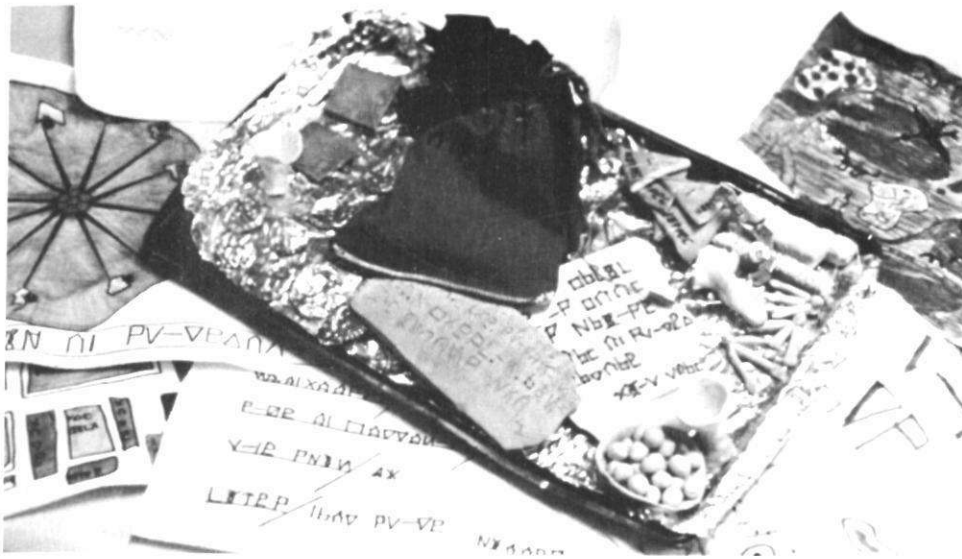

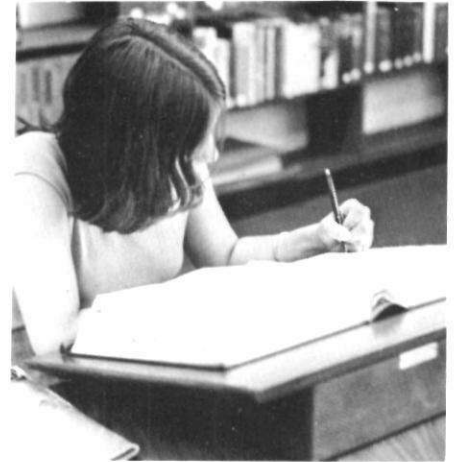

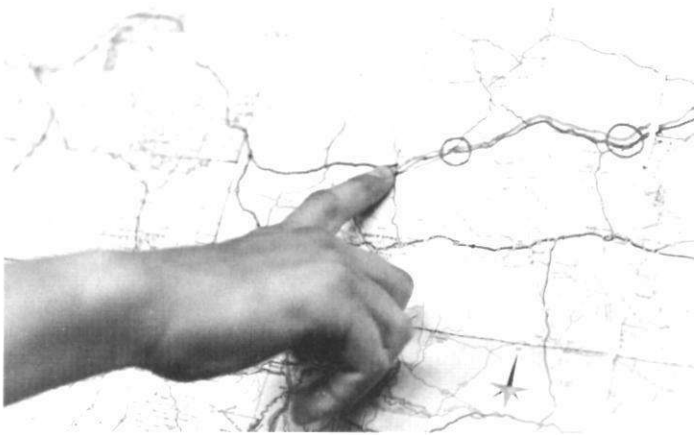

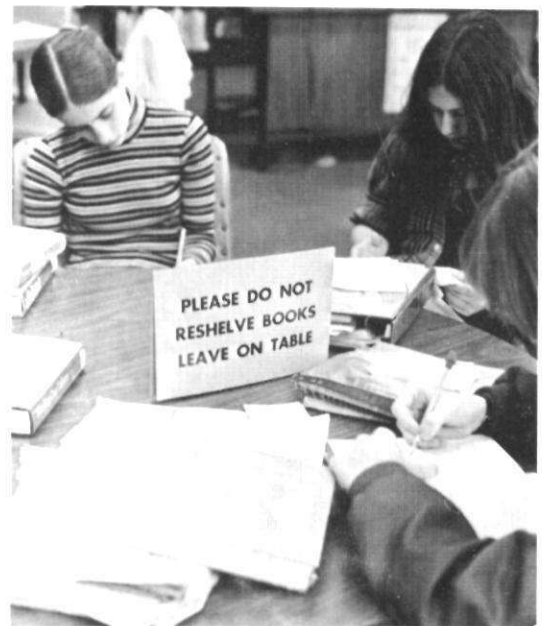
Artifacts that represent the "Slime" culture.

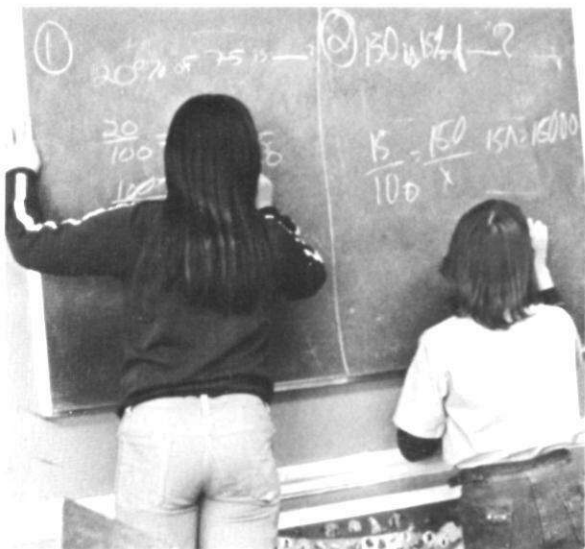

Eddy, & 10 other students, took turns jogging around the Wash. U. track, for 24 hours. Our purpose

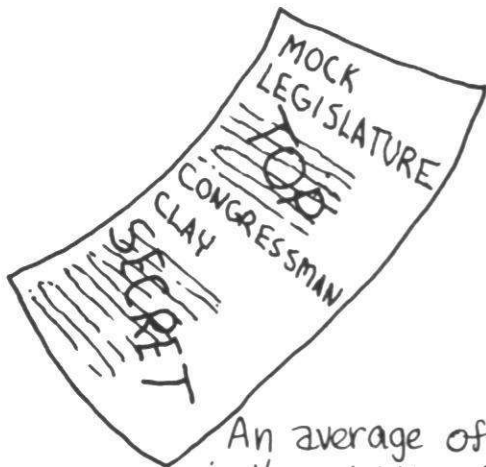

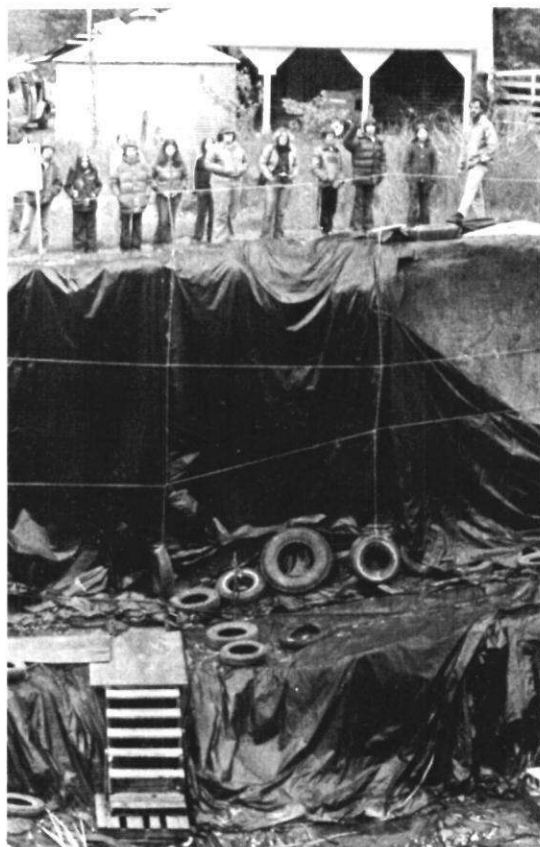
