On behalf of the entire yearbook staff, have a great summer!






We all know that Arthur has a love for baseball, but he likes the challenge of keeping up intellectually with Carol even more.

Wen Wei Du



Beth Sindel








Emily Covey


Fred Neis




Art at Crossroads


Model Building

Carol Lieber's class, Model Building, builds models. "The class is delightful, very self-directed with a great deal of imagination." In taking the class, students can become more aware of where they live.




Sculpture

A "Shield" constructed by LaNelle Coleman stationed in the North Lobby

















BINGO!

Thanks Ray, we love you anyway.


