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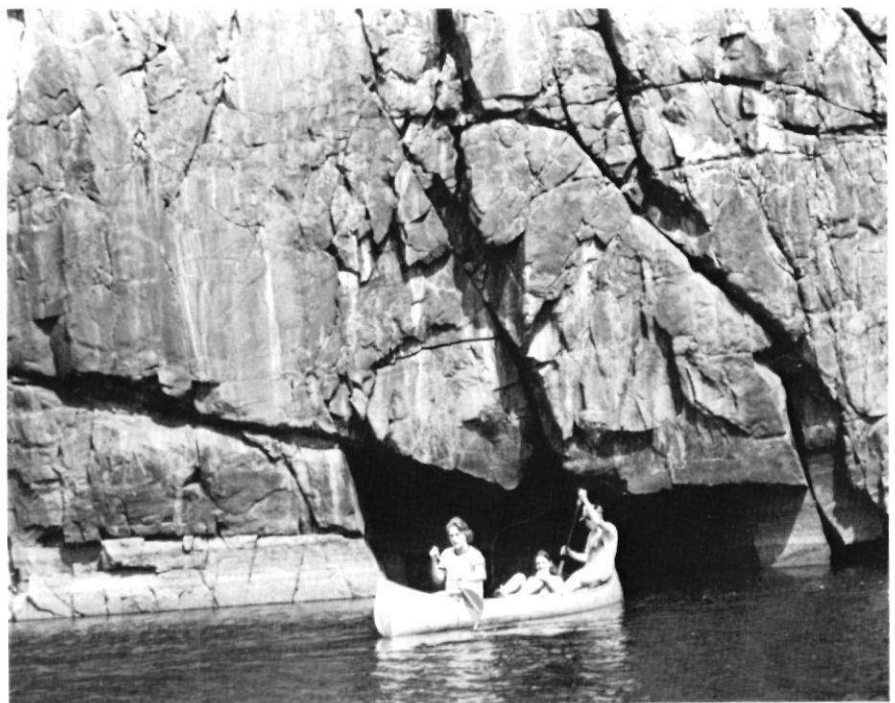

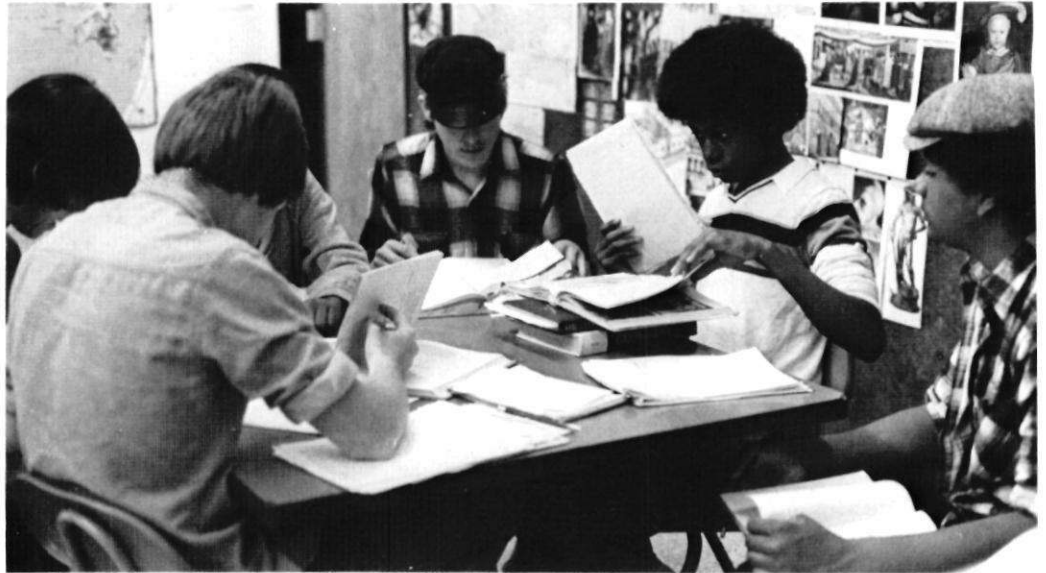

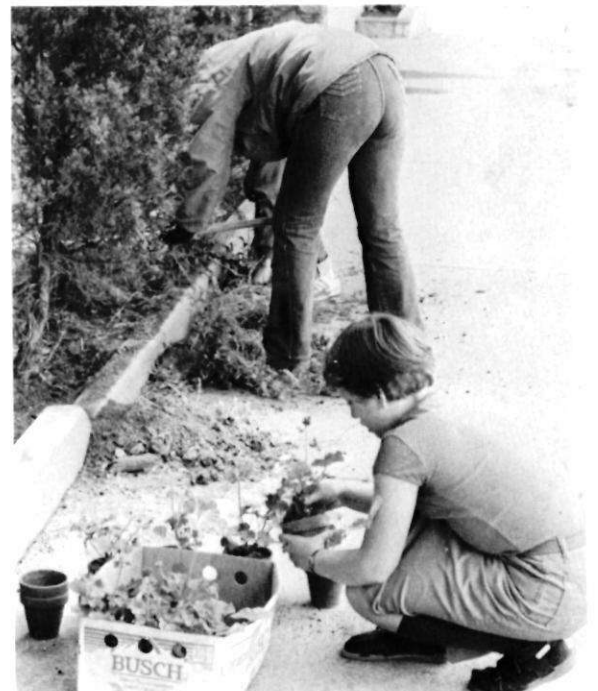


... all Crossroadians are better informed and more aware citizens.

Middle school students also participated in an Olympics Day with students from the College School. Crossroadians displayed their athletic prowess by coming home with the most 1st place ribbons.

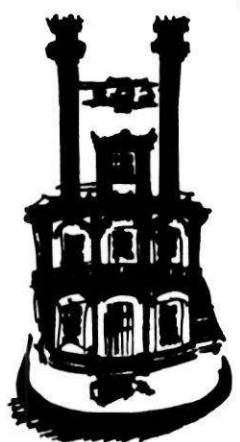

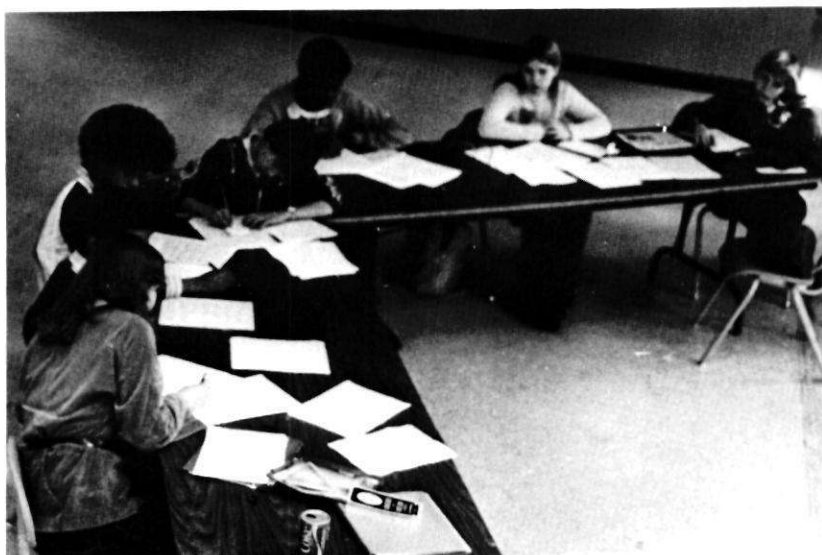
ADVISORY ~ BOARD

All in all, the trip was highly enjoyable, and we all had a much deserved vacation.



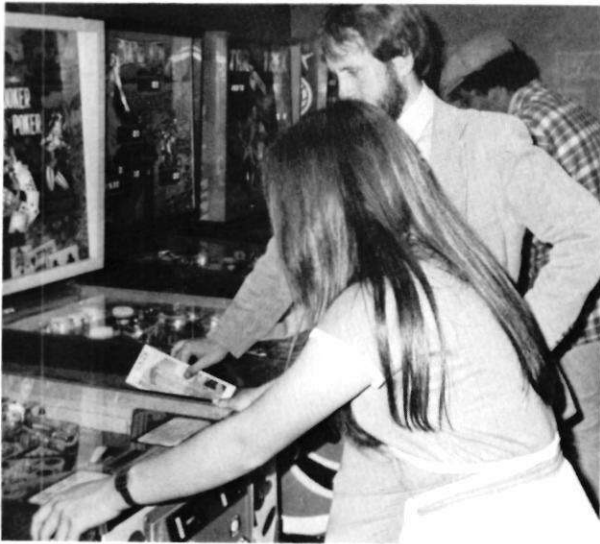
