Steve Jona~~k~~ has been at Crossroads for three years. His most recent accomplishments have been:

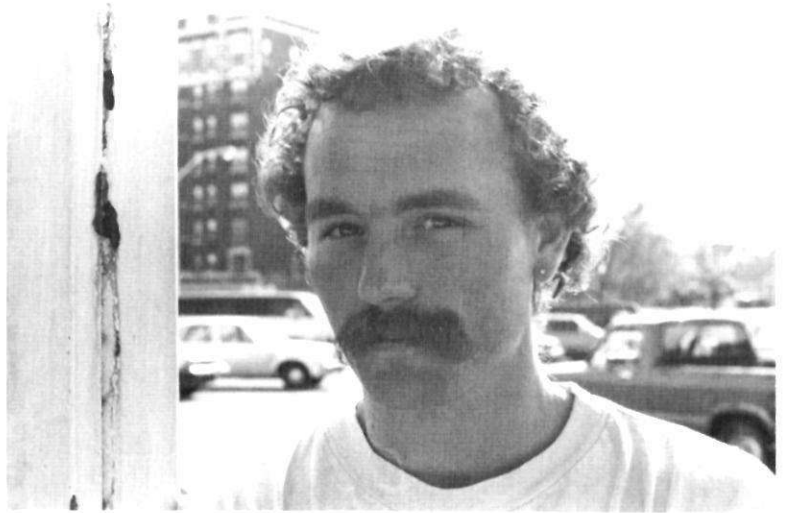

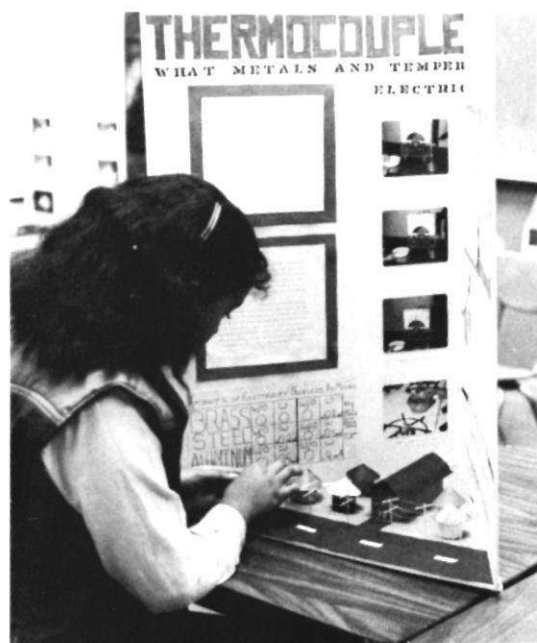
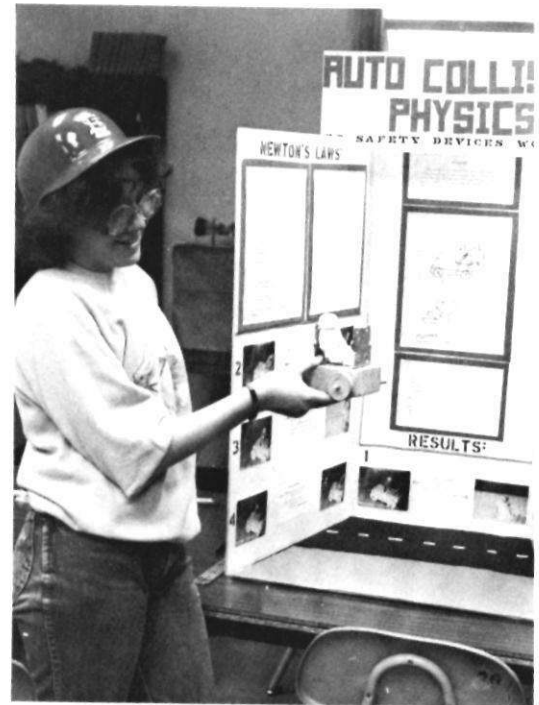


## SPEAKERS
